## Welcome to the Kiwi Team!



General Information 2025

Welcome back to our 2024 Kiwi team students and a very warm welcome to all our new Kiwi team students and their families!

We look forward to meeting you and working with your child throughout the rest of 2025.

Our school wide theme for the year is Tīpuna / Ancestors - Where we come from. Term 1 has a focus on Patuone and Bishop Pompallier. Kiwi team will investigate this through the theme of Snapshots - He whakaahua e te wā, focussing on identity, where we have come from and portraits. Our learnings related to this theme will cover the curriculum areas of Social Sciences, NZ History and The Arts. In Religious Education our learning will be around prayer, 'Ā Tātou Whakapapa - Our Story', The traditions of Holy Week and the Caritas Aotearoa Lenten programme - Restoring Hope: Your Compassion in Action. In Physical Education children will be learning aspects of 'Run, Jump and Throw', ready for our demonstration in week five. In Mathematics we will be working on number including number ID, reading and writing numbers, place value and ordering and comparing numbers. We will also be working on the Measurement strand of this curriculum. Later in the term Kiwi team will begin the Moving Smart Perpetual Motor Programme which works to develop children's physical motor skills that provide the foundation for success in their early school years.

## Morning and Afternoon Routines

The children do need to be at school before the bell goes at 8:50 am. If you aim to arrive, where possible, at around 8:40 (children are not permitted onto school grounds until 8:15am) you will give your child time to unpack and greet their friends before the bell rings. The children may play outside, after they have unpacked or, if staying in the class, read/draw or finish work. Lateness can be unsettling for your child, the other children and the teachers. Staff prayers are held on Thursday mornings. Teachers will not be in the classroom until approximately 8:30 am. on these days. The children are expected to put their bags in the bag area and bring their bookbags inside the classroom. Please encourage your child to be **independent** and let them **carry their own school bag** and do these tasks on their own. Any notices being returned to school, should be in a named envelope or snaplock bag and placed in the designated area in the learning space.

The end of the day can be a little hectic and the children are tired and easily distracted. We would like to ask all parents to wait outside the classroom so that the children can complete their duties and take part in class prayers without being distracted. All children will finish school at 2:50 pm. Please discuss fully with your child where they will be met, and who will be meeting them at the end of the day. Please let us know if someone different is picking them up.

### <u>Parent Help</u>

Parent help is always appreciated. This might be help in the classroom during the school day eg. sharpening pencils, helping with the writing programme or PMP (Perceptual Motor Programme) or help out of the class, for example putting away reading books. If you are able to help in any way let your child's teacher know.

### **Drink bottles**

Your child is welcome to keep a drink bottle inside the classroom. It is important however that the bottles are named and contain <u>only</u> water. It is preferred that these bottles are not iced or wrapped in towels.

### Home Learning

Children will bring home a home learning sheet in the Home Learning books on a Friday. Please take time to read this and complete any activities/reading during the week. Home Learning Books and book bags should be brought to school every day. Once a week your child will bring home a **library book** (we will let you know when the library is open and which day your child's home group will have their session). All library books must be returned to school by library day so a new book can be issued.

Parents often ask what they can do at home with their children to make the transition to school easier for the child. Here are a few ideas:

- Basic manners ~ please/thank you etc.
- Can hold and use a pencil
- Provide supervised opportunities to practise using scissors to cut around pictures and shapes.
- Can put on his/her own jersey/jacket.
- Have some alphabet knowledge and familiarity with books.
- Can follow instructions
- Can handle morning tea and lunch items independently.
- Can pack and unpack his/her bag.
- Can express him/herself clearly.
- Can listen carefully
- Show developing responsibility for his/her own personal items.
- Can initiate some conversation e.g. 'Good morning.'

You are always in the classroom before or after school to look at your child's books or work on the wall. There will also be school wide Sharing the Learning mornings during week 10 of the term. Whānau are also welcome to join class prayers each morning or school prayers on alternate Fridays,

#### **Uniforms**

Please ensure your child is wearing the correct school uniform. Black shoes only. Girls/Boys hair needs to be tied up if it is past their shoulders with either a plain blue, red or black <u>simple</u> hair tie only. Only plain stud earrings can be worn and no nail polish. Please ensure that shoes, sun hats, school jumpers, lunch boxes and drink bottles are <u>all clearly named</u>. Lost property increases daily and if items are not named they cannot be returned to the rightful owners. The lost property box is in front of the Kakapo learning space.

#### **Birthdays**

We value the children's birthdays but ask that you do not send in cakes or other goody bags as we have children in our team who have severe allergies to particular food items. We also ask that children hand out birthday invitations either before or after school (or give them to their teacher) as children feel left out when they are not invited.

#### Behaviour

At St Joseph's we expect children to behave in a way that demonstrates the Mercy values of **Tika** – Justice, **Pono** – Truth, **Aroha** – Compassion, **Manaakitanga** – Hospitality and **Tapu** – Respect for our Environment. We encourage the children to take responsibility for their actions.

#### Miscellaneous

It would be appreciated if each child could bring a box of tissues to school for use in the classroom during the year.

#### Missions

During the year children are encouraged to bring mission money to school (any coin amount). There is always a mission box on the prayer table and the school has a different mission focus each term to which the school makes a substantial contribution. Alternatively your child can bring a packet or can of non-perishable food for the food bank, or laundry and bathroom items are also always needed. It is a good idea for the child to do something like help in a small way at home or do something to make others happy, to earn the mission money or item.

#### Stationery

This can be purchased online through Office Max or by looking on the School Website under Enrolments for the list of items required (contact the school office for any queries). Please make sure you are purchasing 'Kiwi Team and the appropriate Year level' stationery. Please do not cover your child's books. All children require a clear Book Bag which most people will have received at their school visit. If your child does not have one they can be purchased from the school office (cash if possible).

Home Groups 13 - 17 also require chair bags. These are an add on to your stationery list. They can be purchased through Office Max or other stationery suppliers.

Let us remember that,


As many hands build a house,

These images may help you in supporting your child to hold a pencil correctly which is important for letter formation.


# How to Hold a Pencil



- 1. Put your thumb and forefinger just above the cone shaped part of the pencil.
- 2. Let the pencil rest between your thumb and forefinger.
- 3. Then put your middle finger underneath for support.

- 1. Put your thumb and forefinger about 3 cm above the coned end of the pencil.
- Let the pencil rest between your thumb and forefinger.
- 3. Then put your middle finger underneath for support.

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
